PASTOR'S THOUGHTS

Making the Connection

Soon after I arrived at Anna Naz I challenged you to compile a top 10 "hit list" of people who aren't saved that you could pray for and hopefully have the opportunity to share Christ with. In the bulletin I still have the guide to praying for opportunity to invite people to a relationship with Jesus Christ. There is nothing more important in the church then seeing lives transformed by the power and love of Jesus Christ. People don't care how much you know until they know how much you care. Influential people connect with others on a deep level. The stronger the influence you want to have the stronger the relationships you need to build. Look at the life of Jesus; he was all about connecting with other people and getting involved in their lives. People knew He cared. They could see it and feel it. And people listened to what He had to say. If you want to live like Christ love people.

In Acts 8 we find the story of Philip and the Ethiopian. I love this story because it really helps us see how God can and will place us in places at specific times with the right message for a passing opportunity. I think too often we don't realize that God may in fact be setting us up for an encounter with someone who needs Jesus. Sometimes it's the person in the office building you work. It may be the customer passing by or the man walking his trash down to the curb. Have you ever thought to stop and hear what is being said around you?

When you're working and you hear "I'm worried about my Job, my future, my marriage, my child. I'm scared of dying. It could be your "passing chariot". When you hear I don't like myself. Nobody likes me. Should I be involved in this or that? What does God have to do with all of this? It could be your "passing chariot". When you hear my boyfriend asked me to marry him. I'm having a baby. My cancer is back. My spouse is leaving. It could be your "passing chariot". You may have more passing chariots then you realize. I want to give 4 simple principles we can learn from this story:

1. Be where God wants you. (vv.26-30, 39)

Just like Philip we must go out into the roads of the world to trust God to lead us to those seeking him. Without one question Philip got up and went. God handled the details, set up the appointment, timed the arrival, and told him which chariot and what to do. God is sovereign. Philip sensed the impulse and movement of the spirit. The problem is not the spirits willingness to guide and direct us, the problem is our not being surrounded enough to the spirit to sense and know his direction.

2. Be watching the people around you. (vv.27, 32, 34)

A good place to start with people is with where the persons concerns are focused and then bring the gospel to it. Philip engaged in conversation after running up to the carriage. He didn't just start running next to it and wait and see if the man would see him and then respond. No instead we must engage people. And the key was that Philip was welcomed. There were some differences between Philip and the

Eunuch. One was Greek and the other Ethiopian. One a Jew the other a Gentile. One an evangelist the other a government worker. One poor and the other rich. The question we have to ask is what we are going to do with the differences? Do we back away and say No not for me or someone else will be better at this one? I think better we take to heart and ask the question do I follow God this simply and completely? So what did Philip do? He took ahold to the power of observation. He waited to find out where the man was in his understanding before diving in with the gospel and secondly he engaged the man at a meaningful level.

3. Be ready to adapt yourself to where others are. (vv.35-36)

We must remember that some people aren't where we think they should be. Being Christ to people can take time to see results. We have to be willing to throw everything aside and focus on the person we are trying to reach for Jesus. Are we waiting for others to adapt to YOU? To learn YOUR vocabulary? To come to YOUR meeting? To enter YOUR safe Christian culture? Or....are we ready to go out into the world outside YOUR Christian environment find those who need Christ, Listen to them, love them, and lead them to Christ? The Failure to spread the gospel is often not for a lack of courage but for a lack of willingness to be inconvenienced to spend the time necessary for getting into another person's world and problems. In this day of the "busy Christian" perhaps one of the hindrances to the spread of the gospel is our willingness to commit ourselves to the hard and time intensive task of listening, adapting, and loving others into a relationship with Christ.

4. Be bold in telling those you meet about Christ. (vv.31, 35-36)

This Ethiopian represents many people today who are religious, read the Scriptures, and seek the truth, yet do not have saving faith in Jesus Christ. They are sincere, but they are lost! They need someone to show them the way. The man didn't know because no one had told him. There are many waiting to be told about Jesus. One conversation can make a radical difference in someone's life.

In John 4 we find Jesus passing through Samaria. While the disciples went into town Jesus stayed back at a certain well. This certain act was not random but I believe a divine appointment between Jesus and the Samaritan woman. Because Jesus had this encounter this woman went back to her town and brought them to see Jesus. See this women's testimony convinced the others (4:39). When they came and heard Jesus and experienced Him personally they really knew Jesus was the savior. We have to get out of our comfort zone and see the passing chariots that God brings our way. God has given us the role of going and being His ambassadors (2 Corinthians 5:18-20). How will you establish common ground with someone you ordinarily would not intersect with?


