What is Wisdom?

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Wisdom is the right use of one's knowledge, insight and skill to the glory of God. It originates in the fear of the Lord (Proverbs 1:7, 9:10; Job 28:28; Psalm 111:10).

What is a Fool?

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A fool is the person who casts off the fear of God and thinks and acts as if he could safely disregard the eternal principles of God's righteousness (Psalm 14:1, 92:5-6; Proverbs 14:9)

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- ©Doesn't listen to instruction (1:7, 15:5, 23:9, 24:7, 10:21)
- Conclude the constant of the

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- Talker rather then a listener (18:2, 18:13)

Thoughts on Proverbs 1

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Wisdom vs. Folly



- Verse 23:wisdom corrects
- Verse 24: wisdom warns. She tells people what they need to hear not what they want to hear.



- Wickedness is a choice (v.24-25,29-30)
- Rejecting wisdom has consequences (v.26-29)
